- Measuring performance based on financial stability, quality scores and compliance with best practices.



Bad Debt

The Kansas Hospital Association's report on the importance of the healthcare sector to local economies<sup>1</sup> estimates there is a spill-over effect into other sectors of the economy of 31 cents for every dollar spent. In addition, an estimated .40 jobs are created for every job in the hospital.

- *NVCH currently has* **166** *employees which has a secondary impact of* **+66.4** *jobs.*
- The total direct wages paid for FY 2020 was \$8,673,630 and the secondary impact of +\$2,688,825 income generated in other businesses and industries.

## WHAT DOES THIS MEAN

## **Community Health Improvement**

Nemaha Valley Community Hospital (NVCH) provides a wide variety of services to help improve the overall health in the communities that we serve. We use our resources and personnel to provide important health education and information. These activities extend above and beyond routine patient care and are not billable services. We host a variety of community based seminars, monthly support groups, an annual health fair and many other educational opportunities. Support groups we host include Diabetes Support, the Better Breathers Club, Grief Support and Infant Loss Support. We provide access to Alzheimer's Education, a Breastfeeding Clinic, Babies Best Start Program, Cardiac Rehab, two Certified Diabetic Care & Education Specialists, Certified Car Seat Technician, Re -Power Program, two Certified Application Counselors for Marketplace Insurance and a Volunteer Services Program. Our Licensed Social Worker provides assistance with Living Wills, Durable Power of Attorney, Medicare guidance and bereavement counseling.

## **Community Support**

Employees at Nemaha Valley Community Hospital donate their time and skills to a variety of community groups and organizations including; Alzheimer's Association, American Legion Riders & Auxiliary, American Red Cross, Axtell EMS, Axtell Library, Baileyville Benefit, Boy Scouts Troop 71, Catholic Charities Summer Food Program, City of Seneca, Highland Community College, Junior Achievement, Kansas Shrine Bowl, Nemaha Central, St. Peter & Paul, Centralia and Axtell schools, Nemaha County STEP Foundation, Nemaha County Training Center, Seneca Community Television, Rural Development Association of Northeast Kansas, Seneca Janes, United 4 Youth and area 4-H Clubs, altar societies, community benefits, churches and other recreation programs.

## **Charitable and In-Kind Contributions**

Nemaha Valley Community Hospital practices good citizenship by providing charitable contributions and in-kind donations of good or services to local charitable organizations. Local organizations include, but not limited to, American Cancer Society, American Legion Riders, Axtell Schools, Centralia Schools, Junior Achievement, Knights of Columbus, Nemaha County Historical Society, Nemaha County STEP Foundation, NCTC, Nemaha Central Schools, Race Against Breast Cancer, Seneca Area Chamber/SDI, SCTV, Seneca Volunteer Fire Department, Spring Creek Golf Course, St. Peter and Paul School, Wetmore Schools and many area altar societies and churches.

## **Financial Assistance**

Nemaha Valley Community Hospital, as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) tax exempt entity, provides charitable medical care to those who qualify. The hospital has financial assistance policies which outline the procedures for patients of limited means to apply for help with payment for their medical care.

## Third Party Contractual Adjustments & other Discounts

In addition to financial assistance provided to those who qualify, Nemaha Valley Community Hospital also accepts any patient who carries Medicare, Medicaid, Blue Cross Blue Shield and a variety of other insurances. The cost of providing medical care often exceeds the amount these insurers pay for the services provided thus creating a shortfall.

## **Bad Debt**

Uncompensated care includes services for which Nemaha Valley Community Hospital billed but did not receive payment from the patient or the insurer.
