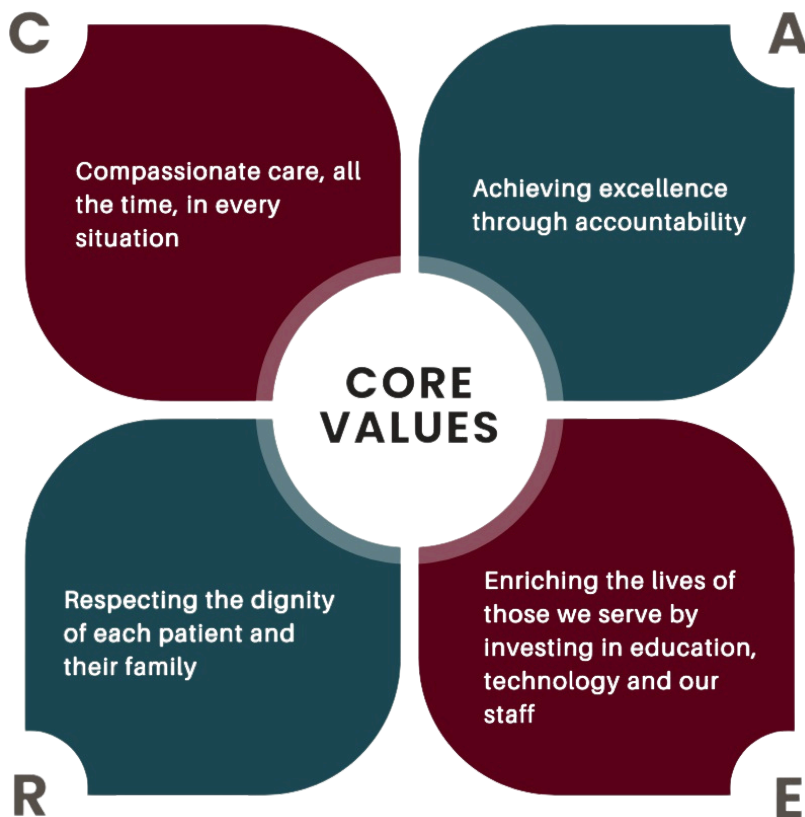
MISSION:

School Partnerships

In 2025, NVCH expanded its health education outreach to area schools, delivering presentations on topics that matter most to today's youth. From preventing hearing loss and understanding the dangers of vaping to the risks of energy drinks. In 2026, NVCH will further strengthen this outreach by adding presentations on hygiene, mental health awareness and more to better support student wellness.

Educating students at this stage builds a foundation for healthier habits, increased resilience, and stronger decision-making that will carry into adulthood. By reaching the younger generation where they are, NVCH is investing in a healthier future for our entire community.



Industrial Wellness Expansion

Recognizing that health education and preventive services are vital in workplaces and schools, NVCH expanded its outreach across the region. This year, our team provided CPR/AED training, Stop the Bleed sessions, and biometric screenings to organizations including CNB Custody, Nemaha Central Schools, Highland Community College, United Bank & Trust, and others.

NVCH also donated Stop the Bleed kits to area schools, helping strengthen emergency preparedness and create safer learning environments. Additional growth of our Industrial Wellness program is already planned for 2026.

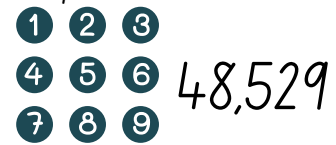

Strengthening Rural Health Access

Nemaha Valley Community Hospital remains committed to expanding and improving access to high-quality, comprehensive healthcare services close to home. In rural communities like ours, access is often one of the greatest barriers to receiving timely, specialized care. Over the past year, NVCH has made significant strides toward bridging these gaps through the addition of new providers, expanded partnerships, and specialized services designed to meet the evolving needs of our community.

Strengthening Regional Partnerships

NVCH continues to collaborate with Sabetha Community Hospital and Holton Community Hospital to share specialty providers—including surgeons and a dermatologist—across all three facilities. This shared-service model increases appointment availability, reduces travel burdens, and ensures patients can receive advanced specialty care within their own communities.

Expanding Local Oncology Care

In early 2026, NVCH will open its new Oncology Infusion Clinic, a service that will provide patients the opportunity to receive cancer treatments locally rather than traveling long distances. This expansion will not only enhance convenience for patients and their families but will also ensure that care is delivered in a familiar, supportive environment—right here at home.



The Oncology Infusion Clinic represents a major step forward in NVCH's commitment to addressing the growing need for cancer care services in Nemaha County and surrounding areas.

Prioritizing Mental Health Access

In addition to expanding specialty medical care, NVCH is also enhancing access to mental and behavioral health services. This year, we welcomed Ben Piper, LCSW, to our team as a new Mental Health Provider. Ben offers individual counseling and therapy for patients of all ages, addressing a range of mental health needs including anxiety, depression, trauma, and stress management.

By bringing licensed mental health services directly to our community, NVCH is helping to remove the stigma and barriers often associated with seeking behavioral health support.



Commitment to Comprehensive Care

Through new services, expanded partnerships, and continued investment in local care, Nemaha Valley Community Hospital remains dedicated to improving access, strengthening our region's healthcare system, and ensuring that every patient can receive the care they need—close to home.

Community Health Education and Outreach:

In 2025, 94 Nemaha Valley Community Hospital (NVCH) employees gave their time and talents to support organizations and initiatives throughout Nemaha County and the surrounding area. Together, our staff and Volunteer Services Program contributed over 4,000 volunteer hours to strengthen the health, safety, and well-being of our community.

NVCH employees volunteered through local churches, schools, civic organizations, 4-H clubs, veterans' groups, blood drives, and special projects such as making mats for the homeless. Many also dedicated time to hospital-led outreach and education efforts, helping promote health awareness and injury prevention across the area.

Throughout 2025, NVCH continued to expand its outreach initiatives. As previously mentioned, our team partnered with Nemaha County EMS to provide Stop the Bleed and CPR/AED training to community members, schools, and local organizations. Additional educational efforts focused on Diabetes Prevention and Education, Fall Prevention, Preventative Health Care, Cancer Prevention, Chronic Care Management, and Mental Health Awareness. The Nemaha Valley Health Care Foundation also hosted a three-day educational series, offering guidance on estate planning, securing your digital life, and Medicare education and insights. These programs reflect NVCH's ongoing commitment to meet our community where they are—bringing health education, safety, and resources directly to those who need them most.

At NVCH, community is at the heart of our mission. Every hour our employees spend volunteering—through health education, outreach, or community service—is an investment in the well-being of our friends, families, and neighbors.

Every three years, NVCH conducts Community Health Needs Assessments (CHNA) to identify and prioritize the most significant health concerns in the areas it serves. This process involves collaboration with community partners to ensure that the hospital's efforts are focused on the greatest needs.

Using the results of each CHNA, NVCH develops a CHNA Implementation Plan that outlines goals, objectives, and strategies for addressing identified priorities. The plan serves as a guide for how NVCH will work to enhance health outcomes and strengthen community well-being.

Community benefit programs include activities and services that promote health and healing without regard for profit. NVCH's Implementation Plan reflects its ongoing commitment to collaboration and delivering meaningful, impactful care. Key priorities identified in the 2024 assessments include mental health, obesity, chronic disease management, and youth health education. Each year, as part of our responsibility as a non-profit Critical Access Hospital, Nemaha Valley Community Hospital (NVCH) prepares a Community Benefit Report to demonstrate our financial and community impact. However, NVCH's contributions extend far beyond measurable dollars and data. This report reflects the many ways our physicians, nurses, administrative teams, ancillary departments, and volunteers work together to make a positive difference in every life and every community we serve.

According to the Kansas Hospital Association's 2025 report, The Importance of the Health Care Sector to the Nemaha County Economy, the health care sector plays a vital role in sustaining our local economy. In Nemaha County alone, health care organizations support approximately 832 jobs, generate nearly \$44.7 million in labor income, and contribute an estimated \$356,100 in local sales tax revenue each year. These figures underscore the essential role that health care institutions like NVCH play—not only in protecting the health of our residents but also in supporting the economic vitality of our region.
